

LUJ has a new home in Ryogoku in the heart of Tokyo's historic Shitamachi, or Low City. Ryogoku is located in Sumida-ku, one of the 23 wards of central Tokyo, and is one of Tokyo's cultural and entertainment centers, with such attractions as Edo-Tokyo Museum, the Sumida Hokusai Museum, the Kanto Earthquake Memorial Museum, The Yasuda Garden, Skytree (a ways off, but looming large), the Sumida River fireworks festival, and of course Kokugikan, the headquarters and main arena of the Sumo organization. The area abounds with excellent eating and drinking establishments, and is an embarkation point for Sumida River cruises. LUJ's new campus promises to be a great place to study and collaborate, and have fun, as we begin our second 25 years in Japan.









NEW LUJ LIBRARY

LUJ Library now has a larger 5th floor space in our new Ryogoku campus. The new library will still have a collection of print books, as well as a selection of magazines, and newspapers, but most of our information resources will be online digital material with millions of eBooks, articles, videos, data, and other materials available on any digital platform. The library space itself will feature quiet and comfortable study and discussion spaces, and a library staff ready to help you with all your research and information needs. LUJ Library has millions of books, magazines, newspapers and other materials available for your online research. Most information is available with the user name: *libuser* and the password *research&investigation* but the librarian can also provide access to information not currently in our collections.

Access to LUJ Library Databases is Easy:

- 1. Go to LUJ's Homepage at https://luj.lakeland.edu/
- 2. Under Current Students and Faculty tab (far right)
- 3. Choose "Library"
- **4.** From the Library page choose the "Resources" tab
- 5. Click on "Digital Resources"
- **6.** Select a books, periodicals, encyclopedia, or other database
- 7. Most materials are accessed with:
 - -username: libuser
 - -password: research&investigation
- 8. Follow the instructions of each database

Signing up for a tutor is Easy!

- 1. Go to LUJ's Homepage at https://luj.lakeland.edu/
- 2. Under Current Students and Faculty tab (far right)
- 3. Choose "Learning Center"
- 4. Scroll down to the Online Tutoring Schedule
- Note that the schedule has both Online sessions, and In-person sessions (in LUJ Learning Center Room 509)
- 6. Select a tutor based on the day, time, and subjects available The subject codes are explained along the top of the schedule
- 7. Click on the link for your selected tutor.
- 8. Choose the day and time of your appointment
- 9. Enter your name and email address and click "schedule event"
- 10. Click "confirm"
- 11. A notice will be sent to your email. Click on the Zoom link at the time of your appointment, or go to the Learning Center if your appointment is "In-person". Your tutor will be waiting for you.




LUJ Book Club is Fun and Interesting! Everyone is Welcome!

Use IA for your research or to just enjoy a classic movie or discover some great music, books or websites from the past.
